#10. The contractor followed up with you and kept their word on what they promised.	

Tallying Your Scores

Now that you've completed this risk assessment for your potential contractor, it's time to tally the scores and see just how risky this contractor may be.

Simply add up each score from #1 through #10 and check your results below.

- <u>0-13:</u> This contractor does not pose much risk to your project. They most likely checked all your boxes and will provide you with high-quality communication, installation, warranty, and overall service.
- 14-26: This contractor may not meet all your criteria, but they may fit more into your budget. They may have more qualities that slip through the cracks than a higher quality contractor, but they pose a 50% chance of risk if you choose them.
- <u>27-40</u>: This contractor is leaning towards an extremely risky decision. They most likely have scored mediocre to high on each of the qualities outlined and will not provide you with the highest quality outcome.
- 41-50: If your potential contractor scored in this range, they pose a high risk for you, your project, and your home. This contractor most likely will not meet your needs and will not care for your needs.
